#### Note from the Director



To All Baby TALK Early Head Start (BTEHS) Stakeholders:

This annual report is designed to give you a snapshot of BTEHS characteristics, program services, and highlights from January 1, 2017-December 31, 2017.

BTEHS maintained enrollment of 74 slots throughout 2017. The most recent federal review was conducted in November of 2015 in the area of Environmental Health and Safety. BTEHS was found in compliance with all regulations in the Head Start Performance Standards and the Head Start Act of 2007. BTEHS anticipates a federal review is FY2018.

May, Cocagne, and King, P.C. conducted a financial audit in the Summer of 2017 and there were no negative findings. The Program BTEHS Budget for FY2017 was \$1,404,935 in federal grant funds that included \$10,973 in COLA funds, with \$26,603 designated to Training and Technical Assistance. The Non-Federal Share goal for FY2017 was \$283,730. With generous support of our community, the goal was exceeded by \$21,415. More information about the budget can be found later in this report.

BTEHS continues to maintain and Gold Circle of Quality Designation from ExceleRate Illinois, the state quality rating system for Early Childhood programs in Illinois. BTEHS is the first and only program serving families with infants and toddlers in Macon County to hold this designation.

We love our community and take joy in the partnerships and collaborations we share to provide the best support to our enrolled families possible. Thank you for taking the time to read this report and learn about what has been happening at BTEHS. We appreciate your support!

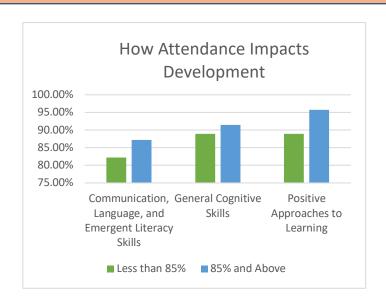
## **Broad Program Goals 2015-2020**

#### School Readiness Data

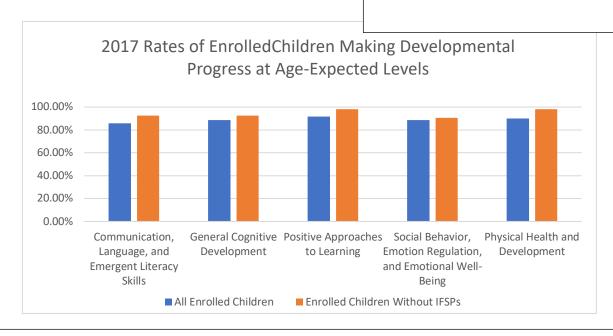


Children whose attendance rate was 85% or more in 2017 made significantly larger developmental gains in language, cognition, and positive approaches to learning than children whose attendance rate was less than 85%.

The first part of our mission statement is "to positively impact child development," so we are careful to collect data on child development to not only help us know how to support each individual child, but also to see how we're doing as a program. We use the Hawaii Early Learning Profile (HELP) as our child development assessment tool.



The graph above shows the percentage of children who showed improvement between assessment periods and maintained a rate of development that is typical for children their age.

# Families and Children Served in 2017

- ⇒ 959595 Total children served
- ⇒ 74 Total families served
- ⇒ BTEHS was 100% enrolled (74 slots) every month in 2017
- ⇒ BTEHS serves less than 5% of eligible children in Macon County
- ⇒ 100% of enrolled children received medical exams
- ⇒ 100% of children 2 and older received dental exams (and many children under 2 did as well

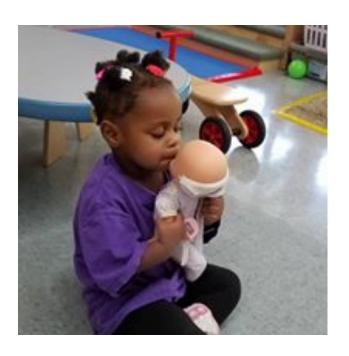
