


A Model for 0-3 Family Engagement

We selected 16 programs across the state








Some specifics:

- On-going Technical assistance




Professional development

Networking & Communication

Professionals value the time and space to discuss common themes of model fidelity, both challenges and successes



Self-Assessment Tool

We must come to common understandings of the meaning of the self-assessment questions

Refining the wording, and providing definitions and clarifications strengthens the tool and makes it more 'user-friendly'



Isolated Programs/Professionals

- What supports do they have?
- Does the tool take their unique situations into account?
- Strong need for on-going networking



Staff Input

Professionals value thinking together about the process of engaging staff and the experience of involving staff in the self-assessment process
